

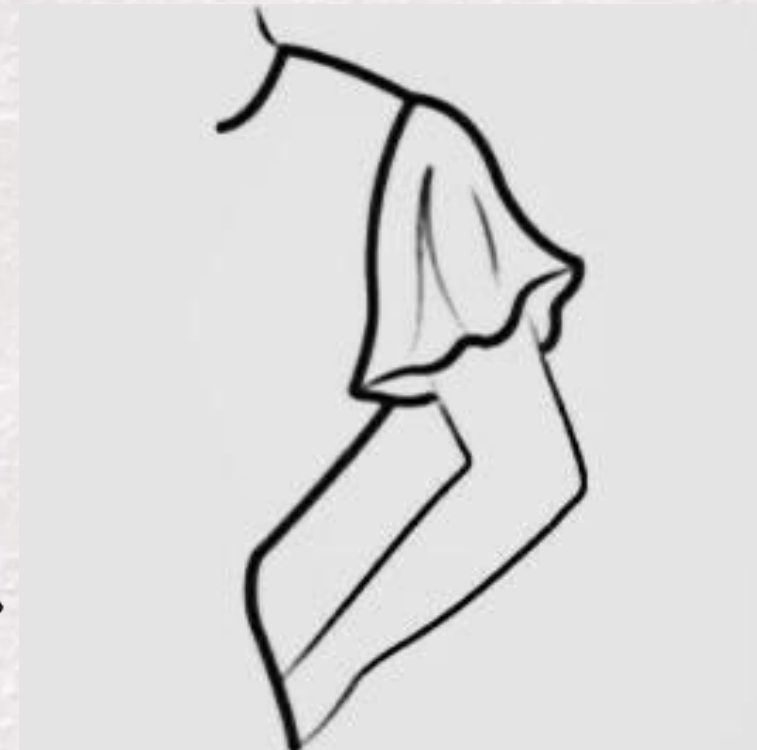

Circular Cap Sleeve

Short flaring sleeve that extends out from smooth cap at armhole.



Marie Sleeve

A full "paned" or "pansied" sleeve gathered into two or more puffs by a ribbon or fabric band above the elbow, worn in the 1620s and 1630s.



Juliet Sleeve

A long, tight sleeve with a puff at the top, inspired by fashions of the Italian Renaissance and named after Shakespeare's tragic heroine.





Bishop Sleeve

Long full set-in sleeve with fullness held at wrist by cuff. May be gathered also at cap.

Bell Sleeve

A set-in sleeve that is smooth at the armhole and flared at the hem edge.





Sweetheart Neckline

Mostly used in dresses without straps, it's formed by two curves recalling a heart shape.



Bateau Neckline

A wide neckline that runs horizontally, front and, back almost to the shoulder points, across the collarbone



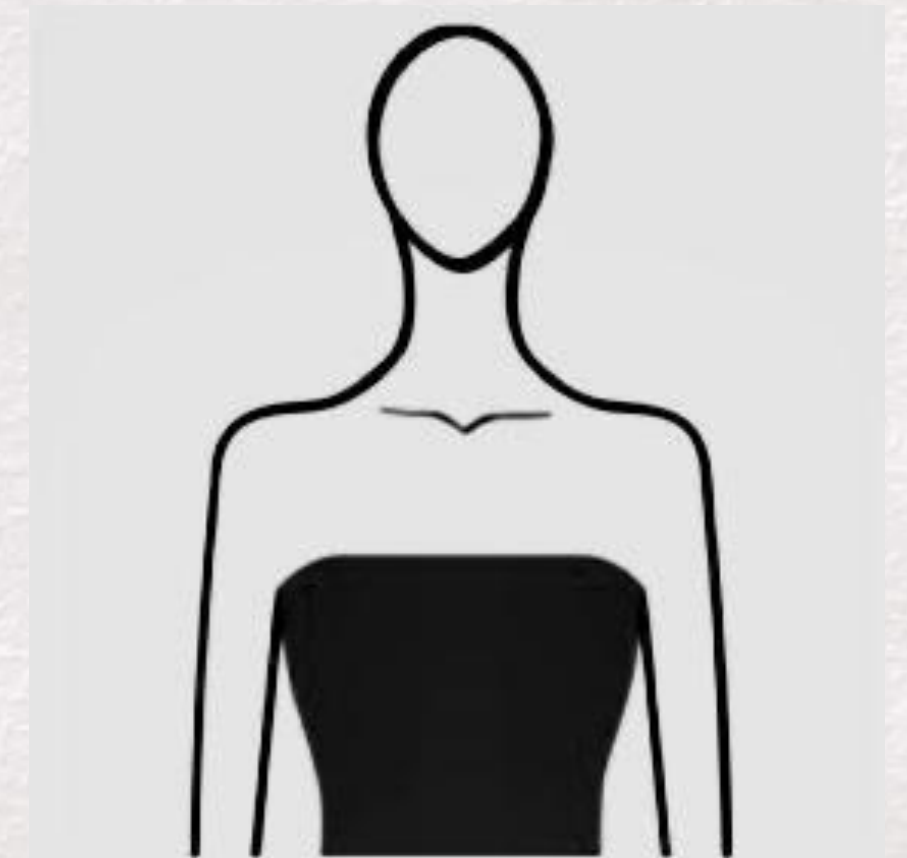
Off-shoulder Neckline



The straps drop laterally on the arms in a more or less soft way.

Straight Across Neckline

Typically in the strapless
dresses, it's a straight
neckline above the breast



Scoop Neckline

U-formed neckline that can be more or less plunging.



Knife Pleated Skirt

Skirt with one or more pleat that face one direction.



Ruffled Skirt



A skirt made up of layers of fabrics, usually to create the illusion of curves.

Draped Skirt

Skirt with traditional fullness
pleated, gathered, or draped on on
side. It is also called sarong skirt if
wrapped.



Mermaid Skirt

The design is similar to mermaid's tail by fitting from waist to knees. It flares out from the knees to the floor.





Asymmetrical Skirt

Asymmetric skirts come in a variety of shapes and suit a variety of figures. In this, hem moves and curls in a pattern at a different level



Traditional Denim Pocket

Rear patch pocket attached to exterior of pants. It ends to a point and has decorative stitching.



Oval Denim Pocket

Rear oval patch pocket



Flap with Bottom Denim Pocket

Back flap pocket with snap
closure



Flat with Belt Denim Pocket

that allows for
expansion from a
pleat in the

Wide Leg Trousers

This model of trousers are wide and flared, particularly large on the bottom





Flare Trousers

Trousers known as bell-bottoms. These very wide hems, were fashionable in 1970s.

Cargo Trousers

They are called combat trousers after their original combat military purpose.



Loosely cut pants, originally design for tough, outdoor activities, with one or more cargo pockets.

Skort

A skort is a pair of shorts with a fabric panel resembling a skirt covering the front. Some skorts are essentially skirts with a pair of shorts hidden underneath.



Stirrup Trousers

A close-fitting pant that tappers at the ankle and the material extends to a band that is worn under the arch of the foot to hold the pant leg in place





Carpenter Trousers

An overall, bib-and-brace overalls, or dungarees, is a type of garment which is usually used as protective clothing when working
